## **INTRODUCTION**

This report contains the first draft of the Audit of Service Provision in Cork City (Step 2 in the process of preparing the CDB Strategy). It seeks to identify all services provided locally by state agencies, CDB members, and local community and voluntary groups. The Audit provides an overview of services provided, the area in which the services are provided and their target groups. The Audit will be regularly updated, and is intended to assist the Board in both the formulation of its Strategy and the co-ordination of services.

This initial draft Audit will now be referred back to the various interests and organisations represented on the Board so that the accuracy of the information contained can be checked. Comments on this first draft should be formally conveyed to the Board in written form.

The main source for the Audit was the questionnaire on service provision, which was circulated to 32 service providers and 605 local community and voluntary groups in August 2000. Initially community and voluntary organisations were identified through a desk exercise using existing information sources. The circulation of information leaflets to every household in the City provided information on additional groups active locally, bringing the total to 605.

The response rate from the service providers was high, with 26 questionnaire returned (ie 81% response rate). 143 community and voluntary groups returned questionnaires – this represents a response rate of 24%.

The geographic spread of the responding community and voluntary organisations is set out below.

The Audit will be updated on an ongoing basis, as the relatively low response rate from community and voluntary groups to the postal questionnaire means that the level of services reported is inevitably understated.

The Audit is divided into two sections. Section I provides an overview of the services provided by the public sector bodies in Cork City. Information on budgets and numbers catered for has been included where available. Section II gives an overview of services provided by community and voluntary groups in the City. Unlike Section I, it is arranged on the basis of services provided rather than the group concerned. Where main services provided by a single group fall into more than one category, the group may have multiple entries.

Services provided by community and voluntary groups have been divided into 16 categories. The table below gives an overview of the level and types of services provided.
